

Having an eye test: what will happen?

You have an appointment to have your eyes tested.

Dr Ursula will test your eyes.



Dr Ursula will say hello, and we will all go into the test room together.

I will ask you to sit down on a special chair.



I will ask you some questions about what you can see and what things

you like to do. I will ask your Mum / Dad / grown-up some questions

about you as well.

I will ask you to look at some fun toys.



I might get Mum / Dad / your grown-up to hide some toys behind you

and then we will see if you can spot them.



I might ask you to put on some funny glasses.



We will look at some letters or pictures together.



I may hold a cover in front of each of your eyes briefly.

I will ask you to put on some glasses and I will hold some lenses in front

of your eyes and wiggle a little light about. It won't take very long.




I may put some drops in your eyes.



After I put the drops in, you can have a break.



Things might look a bit blurry after the drops, like this:



but everything will be back to normal after a few hours.
